A Hidden Treasure

In the middle of Amsterdam's bustling centre stands one of the city's oldest museums, known as Museum Ons' Lieve Heer op Solder (Museum Our Lord in the Attic). Here visitors get to experience the Dutch Golden Age in a special way: a 17th-century canal house with a top floor converted into a chapel. Jan Hartman bought this house on the Oudezijds Voorburgwal and the two adjacent buildings on the Heintje Hoekssteeg 350 years ago. He had the attics of the three houses converted into a Roman Catholic church conforming to the conventions of the day - and yet nothing on the outside would suggest that there was a house of worship inside.

Building the future

Work is going on in and around Museum Ons' Lieve Heer op Solder. To ensure the preservation of the monument, all living spaces, stairs and the beautiful church are restored. This extensive restoration was completed in 2014. The nearby neighboring building has been converted into an entrance building of the museum, offering space for the museum shop, the café and the exhibition space. An underground passage connects this house with the historic home of Jan Hartman.

From Museum to Historic House

In 2014 the church renovations were complete. Until recently, cupboards had been converted into showcases to display art, but now the process is being reversed: the showcases have been removed and the cupboards are once again cupboards. The guideline for restoration is to present the chapel's original function. Colour, light and interior will soon exude the atmosphere of the period in which the last regular Masses were celebrated there in the late 19th century. A free audio tour is available explaining the various periods of time.

Museum Shop

There are gifts and souvenirs available in the museum shop.

Museum Café

There is a museum café on the first floor where you can get a special pastry and good coffee.

Group visits & Guided tours

Due to the limited capacity of this historic house, all groups, including school groups, must be registered in advance.

Guided tours are available in Dutch, English, German and French. Advance booking is required. The cost per guide is € 70,- or € 95,- (maximum group size 10 persons per guide). This does not include the price of a museum ticket. Requests for tours should be submitted to the museum at least a week in advance. A written confirmation is sent by the museum upon receipt.

Drinks and food

The museum café is located on the first floor. In this open, light room you can enjoy a cup of coffee or tea with a delicious piece of cake, a delicious lunch or a special beer from the De Prael brewery. The wall-wide curtain is a design by Theo Tienhooven. This wall curtain is based on the authentic colors found in the historic building and brought back during the restoration.

Getting there

Museum Ons' Lieve Heer op Solder is easy to reach by public transport. The museum is about five minutes' walk from Central Station and is even closer to the Nieuwmarkt metro station.

Trams 4, 9, 16, 24 and 25 stop at Dam Square, from where the museum is also just five minutes' walk. Parking facilities are available for cars at the Bijenkorf car park (Dam Square) and at Central Station car park.
